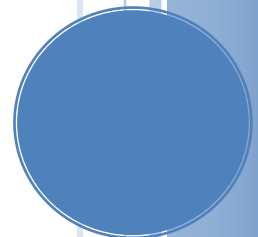

Cat Areas

At capacity, we estimate that the Margaret J. Maclean Animal Welfare Center will house approximately 180 cats and kittens depending upon the mix of adult cats and those that might have kittens. Our feline friends could easily outnumber the canines in residence at any time, while taking up less square footage in the building. When animals are brought into the center, they will be temporarily placed in a holding room while intake information is collected. From holding, they will be moved to the incoming cat and kitten rooms while needs are assessed or to isolation if they have a health issue. When ready for adoption, they will be available for public viewing in the Cat Condo Room or one of two Cat Colony Rooms. People who are considering adoption can meet their potential pet in a comfortable visiting room. Outdoor cat areas will allow for daytime play in a safe, enclosed environment.

Dog Areas

At capacity, we estimate that the Margaret J. Maclean Animal Welfare Center will house approximately 90 dogs and puppies depending upon the mix of adult dogs and those that might have puppies. When animals are brought into the center, they will be temporarily placed in a holding room while intake information is collected. From holding, they will be moved to the incoming dog and puppy kennels while needs are assessed or to isolation if they have a health issue. When ready for adoption, they will be available for public viewing in the Dog Suites. People who are considering adoption can meet their potential pet in a comfortable visiting room. Indoor training and exercise areas provide space for teaching canine residents and dog owners basic skills. Outdoor dog areas will allow for daytime play in a safe, enclosed environment.
